At the 27th Universal Postal Congress, the UPU's member countries are expecting to adopt the new World Postal Strategy - a roadmap for the new work-cycle commencing in 2021. The Congress will also decide on new rules and set policies on the international exchange of postal items.

As part of the proceedings, member countries will elect the next Director General and Deputy Director General and decide on the membership of the UPU's Council of Administration and Postal Operations Council for the 2021-2024 period.

Due to the global spread of COVID-19, the UPU and the Government of Côte d'Ivoire had decided to postpone the 27th Universal Postal Congress. For further information, you may access the following link.
