

Sustain and increase market share






 Modernise and rationalise products and services to offer customers what they want



4. IPP Achievements so far – Step 1



Five Key Changes:

- Definition for both docs and goods
- Classification of letter-post items based on content
- Mandatory application of S10 barcode on small packets
- Classification of physical services speed (non-priority, priority, premium)
- Compliance with emerging security and customs requirements for EAD



4. IPP Achievements so far – Step 2




Four Key Elements:

- Identifies and analyses postal market sector trends



Customer needs – and UPU response





5. IPP recommendations — market needs







Integrated Product Plan (Congress-Doc 35. Rev 1)

- > take note of the report and of the work carried out to develop the IPP for 2022 to 2025;
- > approve the eighteen recommendations;
- ➤ approve, if appropriate, one of the two proposed Convention amendments based on the updated IPP product recommendations;
- ➤ approve the proposal of a general nature (Proposal 04. Rev 1) relating to the implementation of the updated IPP.
