REPORT OF THE ASIAN-PACIFIC POSTAL COLLEGE GOVERNING BOARD

- 1. Introduction, opening remarks, approval of agenda
- 1.1 The 55th Asian-Pacific Postal College (APPC) Governing Board Meeting was held on 30 June 2025. It was attended by nine GB members, namely Australia, China, India, Japan, Korea(Rep.), Pakistan (online), Philippines, Sri Lanka and Thailand.
- 1.2 The meeting was chaired by Mrs Kalaya Chinatiworn, Principal Advisor for Foreign Affairs at the Ministry of Digital Economy and Society, Thailand. The Asian-Pacific Postal Union (APPU) Bureau was represented by Dr Vinaya Prakash Singh (Secretary-General, APPU), Mr Sandeep KP (Consultant, APPU Bureau), and Ms Kwanjai Kajornwuttideth (Manager, Administration and APPU Affairs).
- 1.3 On invitation, Dr Singh, Secretary General of the Union made brief opening remarks on how other restricted unions are wishing to emulate the example of the APPU by setting up their own training institutions. To ensure the College remains to the forefront in its relevance and appeal there are two major developments being implemented i.e., more programmes that will be useful for Ministries and Regulators, as well as reaching out to more countries to cater to the specific training needs of employees. These two developments continue the focus on preparing postal professionals to face the demands of a rapidly evolving sector, thereby supporting the growth of a confident, competent, future-ready workforce for the Asia-Pacific community.

Main information

Secretary General

 Dr Vinaya Prakash Singh from India was elected (at the 2022 APPU Bangkok Congress) as the new Secretary General of the Asian-Pacific Postal Union (APPU). His tenure started on 1 January 2023 and will continue until 31 December 2026.

Staff

- Mr. Anucha Soonglertsongpha from Thailand was appointed as a Lecturer. His contract started on 1 January 2023 and is valid until 31 December 2025.
- Ms. YU Yan from China was appointed as RTCAP/ Consultancy Section Manager. Her contract started on 1 January 2023 and is valid until 31 December 2025.
- Mr. Sandeep KP was seconded as "Lecturer-cum-Consultant" to the Asian-Pacific Postal
 Union since 20 January 2023 by the Government of India for a period of 3 years, which
 can be extended to 4 years based on mutual consent. The expenditure of this position is
 borne by the Government of India.

- Ms. Suchismita Swain was appointed as a Lecturer in APPC on 1 January 2024, and her contract is valid until 31 December 2025.
- Mr. Kenichi Hosokawa was seconded as Lecturer to the Asian-Pacific Postal College from Japan Post. The expenditure of this position is borne by Japan Post. His contract is for a period of 2 years starting from 3 June 2024.

2.2 Doc 2, Appendix A – Courses and workshops

Main information

In 2024, the Training Section of APPU Bureau:

- conducted 12 physical courses and two online courses attended by 142 participants (comprising 131 fellowship participants and 11 self-funded participants)
- new courses were "Digital Transformation in the Postal Sector" and "Postal Strategy: Formulation and Execution"
- conducted 10 physical workshops attended by 53 participants (comprising 23 fellowship participants and 30 self-funded participants)
- completed a total of 59 training weeks with 195 participants from 34 countries
- conducted four ETPs totaling 74 training weeks with 86 participants (69 fellowships; 17 self-funded)
- total capacity building activities organised / hosted by the Bureau in 2024 covered 507 participants (almost double the number in 2023)

2.3 Doc 2, Appendix B - Statement on the use of cash contributions and fellowship grants in 2024

Main information

(i) Cash contributions

Seven members allocated funds for participants to attend courses. Total funds were 7,500,500 Baht.

Usage was split at 6,759,906 on training, and 740,594 on APPC activities.

(ii) Fellowship funds

Funds were received from seven parties, totalling 16,656,536 Baht.

Usage was split at 16,019,152 on training, and 12,965 on APPC activities.

Appreciation was expressed to all parties providing funds for the training section.

6. Specialized Capacity Building Programs

- 6.1 To increase the reach of specialized capacity building programs, the APPC commenced an initiative in 2024 to deliver focused on-site training to larger pools of staff in their home locations. This has been undertaken with the support of the UPU India Fund.
- 6.2 Three events have been held to date, with a further one scheduled during 2025.
- 6.3 The APPC is open to receiving requests / proposals for on-site specialized training programs for all APPU members.

7. Training Impact Assessment Survey

- 7.1 Currently the APPC has a comprehensive multi-level feedback mechanism for all participants attending its training programs. Notwithstanding, there have been requests for an impact assessment survey that provides an insight to the long-term effects of the training programs.
- 7.2 Specific focus of such an impact assessment is:
 - practical application of acquired skills in participants' home organisations
 - observable improvements in performance or work practices following training
 - overall value and return on investment of sending staff to APPC programs
- 7.3 A draft assessment survey has been developed. It is a tool that would be completed by both the training participant and their direct supervisor.
- 7.4 The APPC invites feedback on the draft survey.
