Outcome related to Standards Board



- **Approved the P-status (work item) proposal concerning the encoding of S9 (postal receptacle identifier) and S10 (postal item identifier) on passive RFID tags to for potential benefit of automating the scanning process**

Standards can be at one of six different stages in the approval process.

Status P (Work item): Recognized that work is required to develop an idea. Need to be defined in a written document.

Status 0 (Working draft): Approved for publication as the basis for tests. Testing can be done in a live environment.

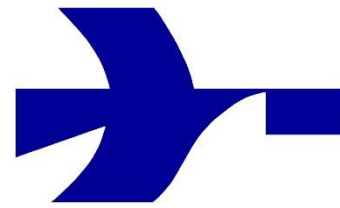
Status 1 (Tested draft standard): Approved as complete solution tested. Minor adjustments can be made.

Status 2 (Approved UPU standard): Approved as very stable and available for use by any interested party.

Status S (Superseded standard): Indicated standard being replaced by another more recent standard but still in use.

Status W (Withdrawn standard): Recognized standard not used and no longer valid.

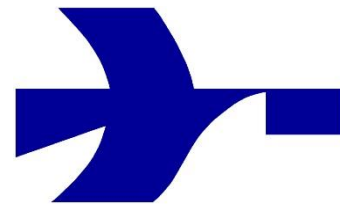
Outcomes related to OARG



- **Approved proposals to create a new article 13-001 on IMPC and consequential changes to the following articles with the date of entry into force of 1 January 2020:
13-002, 13-003, 17-006, 17-007, 17-114, 17-214 and RII**
- **Approved the proposals to amend accounting forms CN 54 (recapitulative statement of sampling) and CN 54 bis (annual recapitulative statement of sampling) in order to cover cases where mail is not received with format separation but sampling is done with format separation, with the date of entry into force of 1 January 2020.**

Outcomes related to Customs Group (1/2)



- **Approved a set of proposals:**
 - to eliminate CP 71 dispatch note, incorporating its information into the CN 23 form,
 - to reduce the standard number of paper CN 23 customs declarations accompanying an item to two.

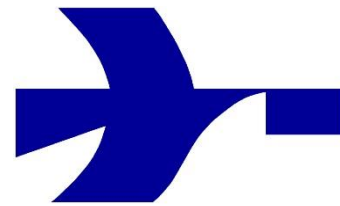

CP 72 manifold set, first part – "Receipt"

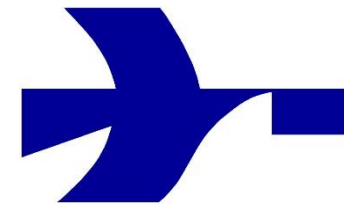

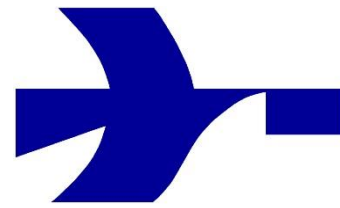


- Took note of the update status of UPU transport publications.

Nearly all transport publications are now up to date and available on the UPU website.

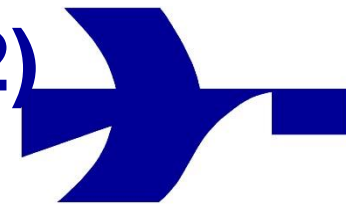

- **Approved proposals to make the exchange of ITMATT messages mandatory for small packets and parcels with the date of entry into force of January 1, 2021.**

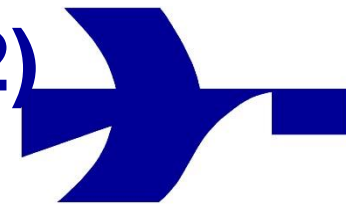

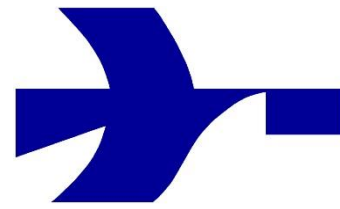

Outcomes related to Electronic Advance Data (2/2)



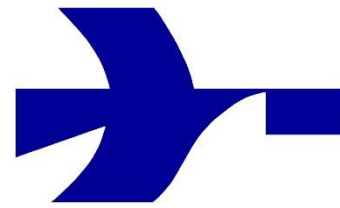
- **POC S4 (autumn 2018) approved the creation of new paragraph 4bis in article 08-002 of the Regulations, making the nesting of S10 (postal item identifier) and S9 (postal receptacle identifier) and inclusion of the information PREDES mandatory with the date of entry into force of March 1, 2020.**

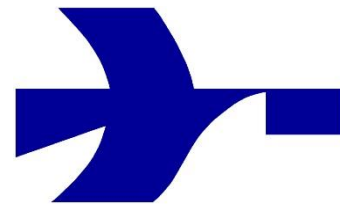

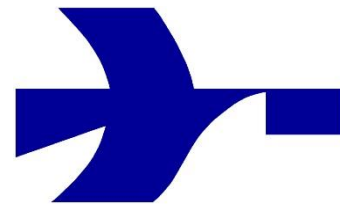
