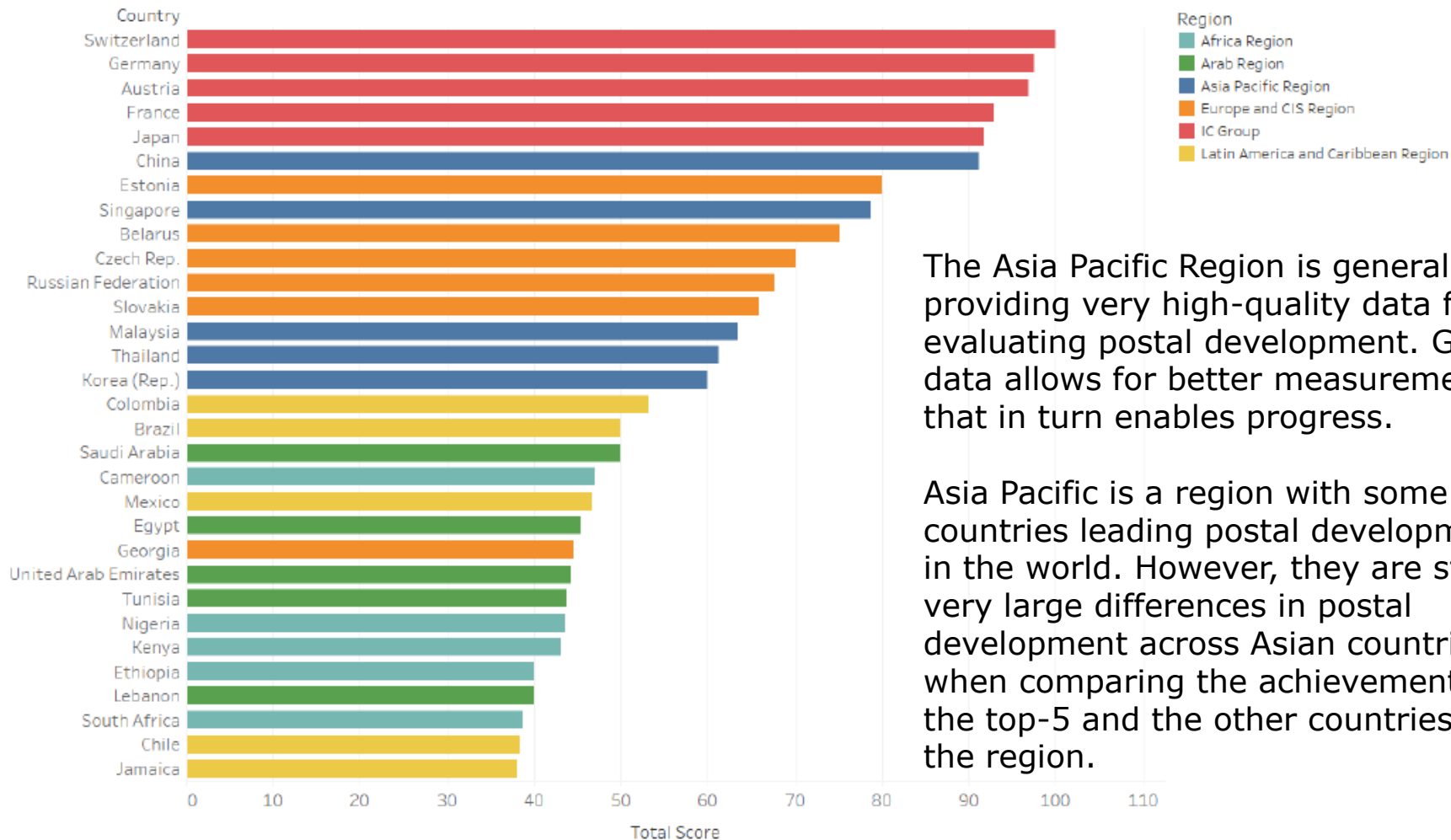

2IPD: Top 5 Countries by Region



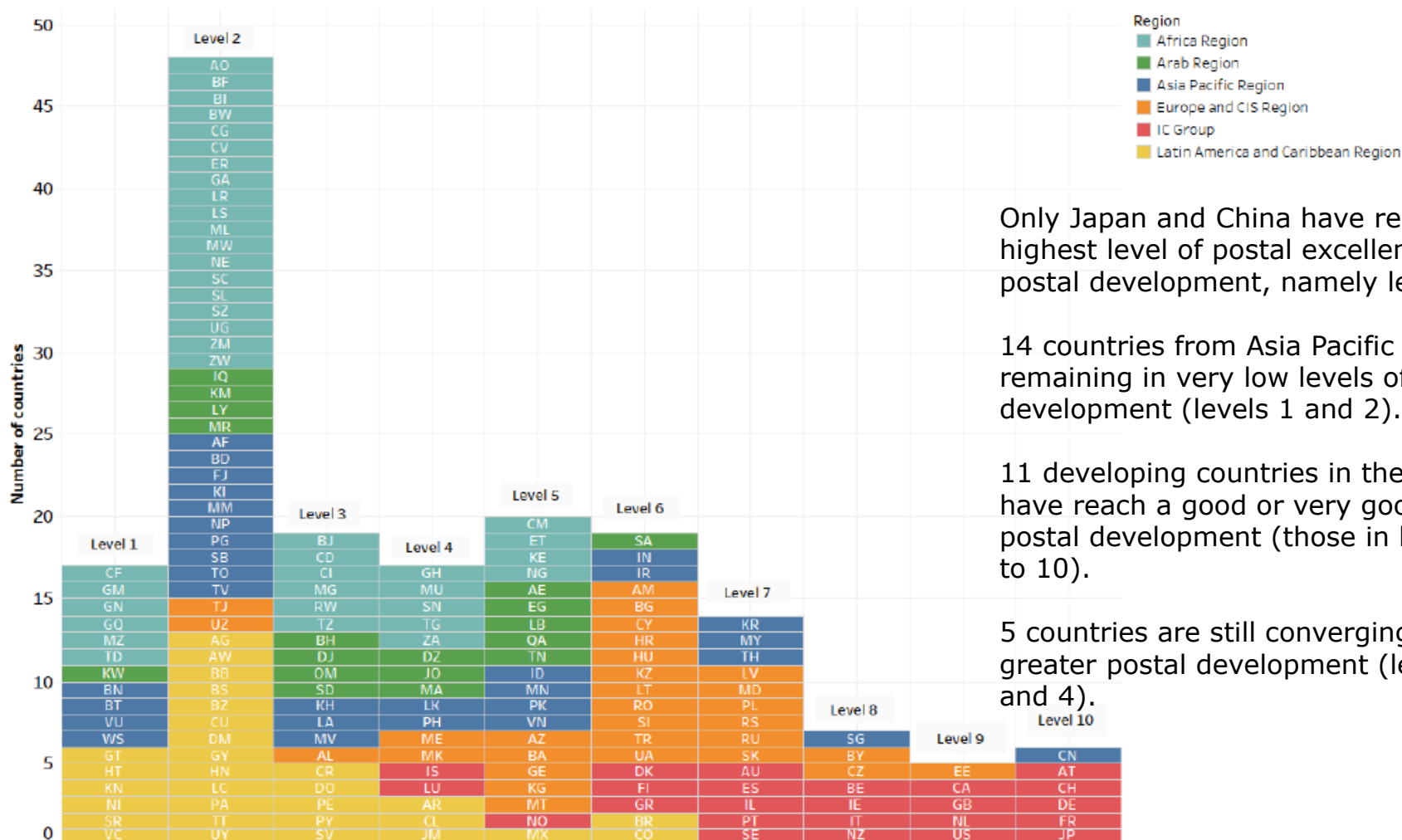
The Asia Pacific Region is generally providing very high-quality data for evaluating postal development. Good data allows for better measurement that in turn enables progress.

Asia Pacific is a region with some countries leading postal development in the world. However, they are still very large differences in postal development across Asian countries when comparing the achievements of the top-5 and the other countries in the region.

2021 Postal Development Levels (PDL) Across Countries And Regions



Only Japan and China have reached the highest level of postal excellence in postal development, namely level 10.

14 countries from Asia Pacific still remaining in very low levels of postal development (levels 1 and 2).

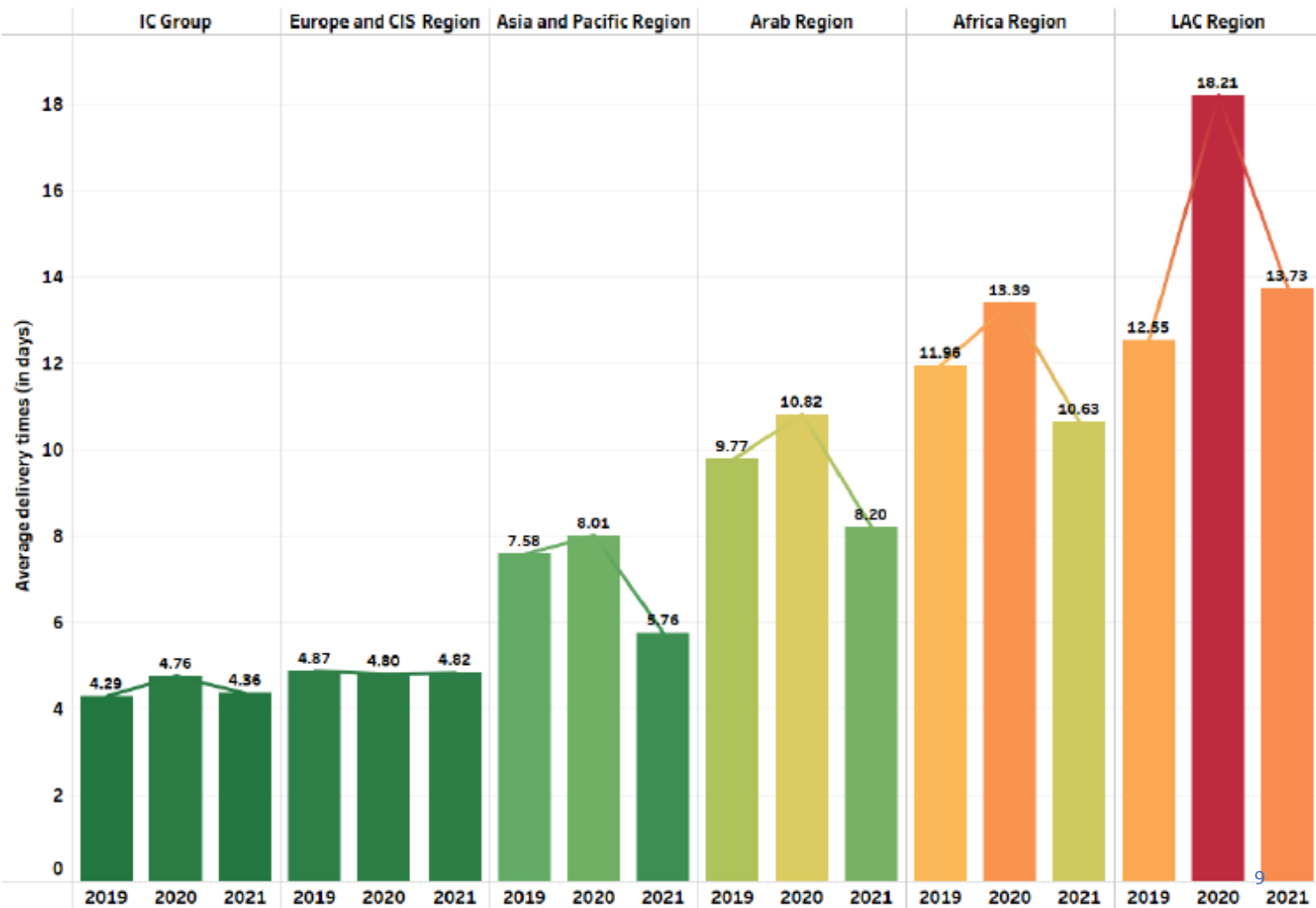
11 developing countries in the region have reach a good or very good level of postal development (those in levels 5 to 10).

5 countries are still converging towards greater postal development (level 3 and 4).

Average delivery time per region over the years



The level of postal reliability has dramatically improved in the Asia and Pacific region with average delivery times decreasing from a high of 8.01 days in average in 2020 to a low of 5.76 in 2021.

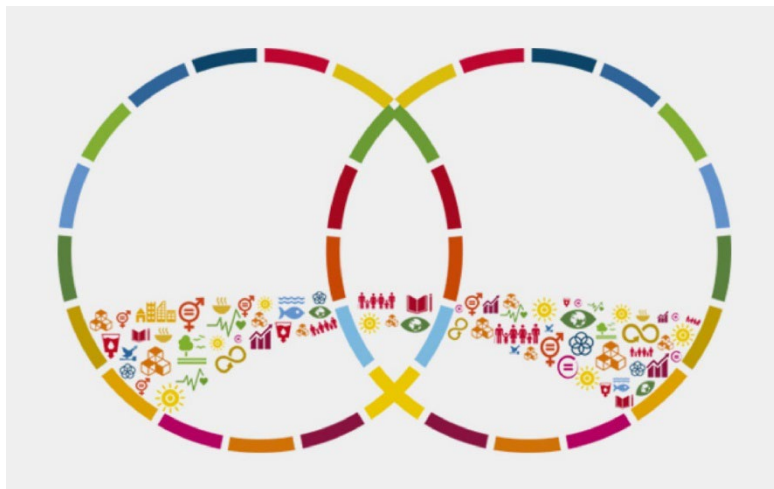

South-South and Triangular Cooperation (SSTC) is our vision



In **South-South and Triangular Cooperation (SSTC)**, traditional donor countries and multilateral organizations facilitate South-South initiatives through the provision of funding, training, management and technological systems, and other forms of support *to share knowledge, skills, resources, and successful initiatives* in different areas.

SSTC involves *3 actors: 2 from the South and 1 from the North*. The latter (can also be an international organization) provides the financial resources so that the countries of the South can exchange technical assistance on a specific topic.

"Nothing for me without me" is the voice of the South in the development cooperation field. Within this framework, the UPU has developed its strategy for the SSTC.

UPU's Abidjan Postal Strategy (2022–2025) lays down the development cooperation between UPU member states based on the SSTC mechanism.

Dear Sir/Madam,

First, I wish to reaffirm my commitment, in my capacity as Director General of the Universal Postal Union, to leading and overseeing the successful implementation of the Abidjan Postal Strategy 2022-2025. This strategy sets out a vision of the Post as an essential driver of sustainable development, and invites governments to do everything possible to reduce the gaps in postal development around the world.

During the previous cycle, the UPU implemented a number of excellent projects under South-South and triangular cooperation, as follows:

- COVID-19 recovery project to supply IT equipment to 19 small island developing states (SIDS), least developed countries (LDCs) and landlocked developing countries (LLDCs);
- Project to provide training for postal officials from developing countries;
- Project to provide training equipment to the Asian-Pacific Postal College;
- Supply of 200 green computers, donated by a member country, to designated operators (DOs) in the Pacific region (an example of a contribution in kind).

Other important projects are currently under implementation, including a project to assess the types of government/social services that can be provided by post offices in order to meet the social responsibilities of member countries' governments in fulfilling the UN Sustainable Development Goals and to enhance postal revenue.

The UPU is currently devising several useful projects to enhance postal IT infrastructure among SIDS, LLDCs and LDCs. Furthermore, it is preparing projects aimed at upgrading postal infrastructure through the provision of postal equipment, particularly for countries that have suffered significantly as a result of COVID-19.

It is important that the world community now come to the aid of DOs, particularly those in SIDS, LLDCs and LDCs. It is essential to support these DOs in every possible way. This contribution may be in cash or in kind. In particular, the UPU would like to upgrade both physical and IT infrastructures in these countries.

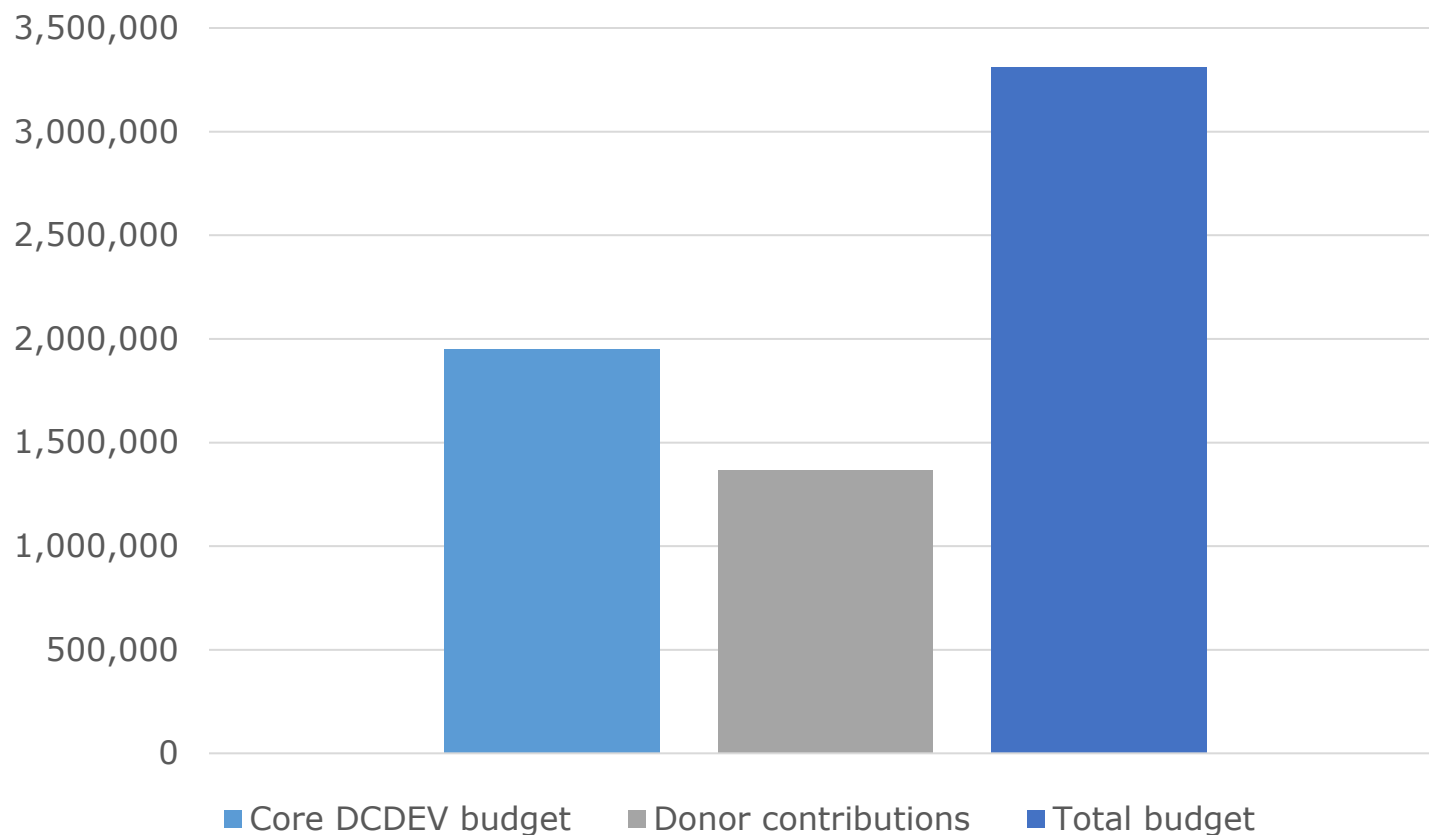

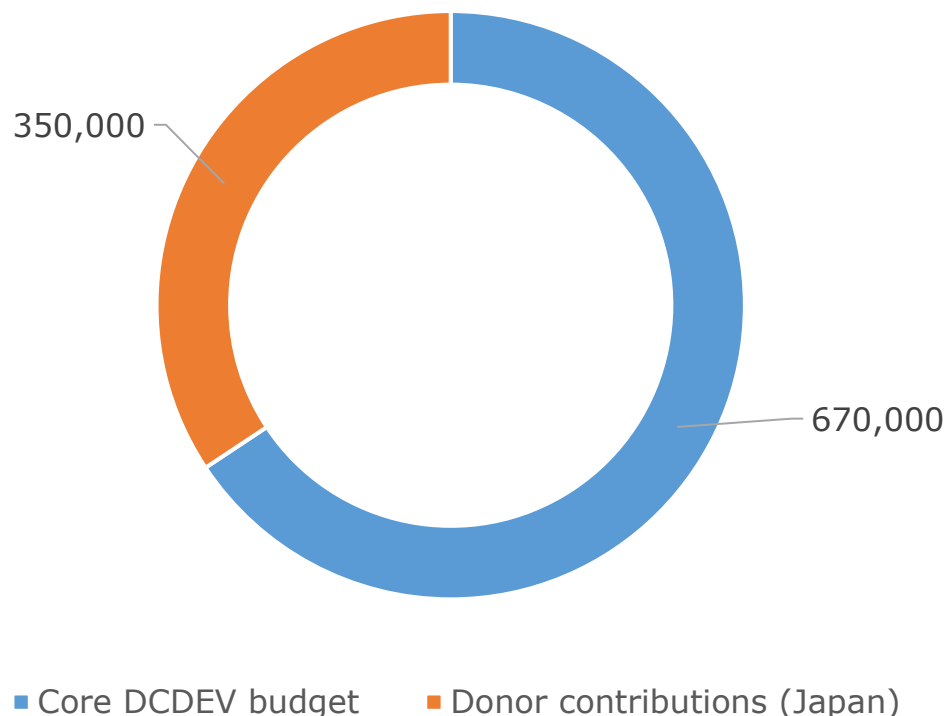

- *A special project is being developed for Tonga, in cooperation with UPU's DRM team to help the country recover from the underwater volcanic eruption and tsunami (January 2022).*

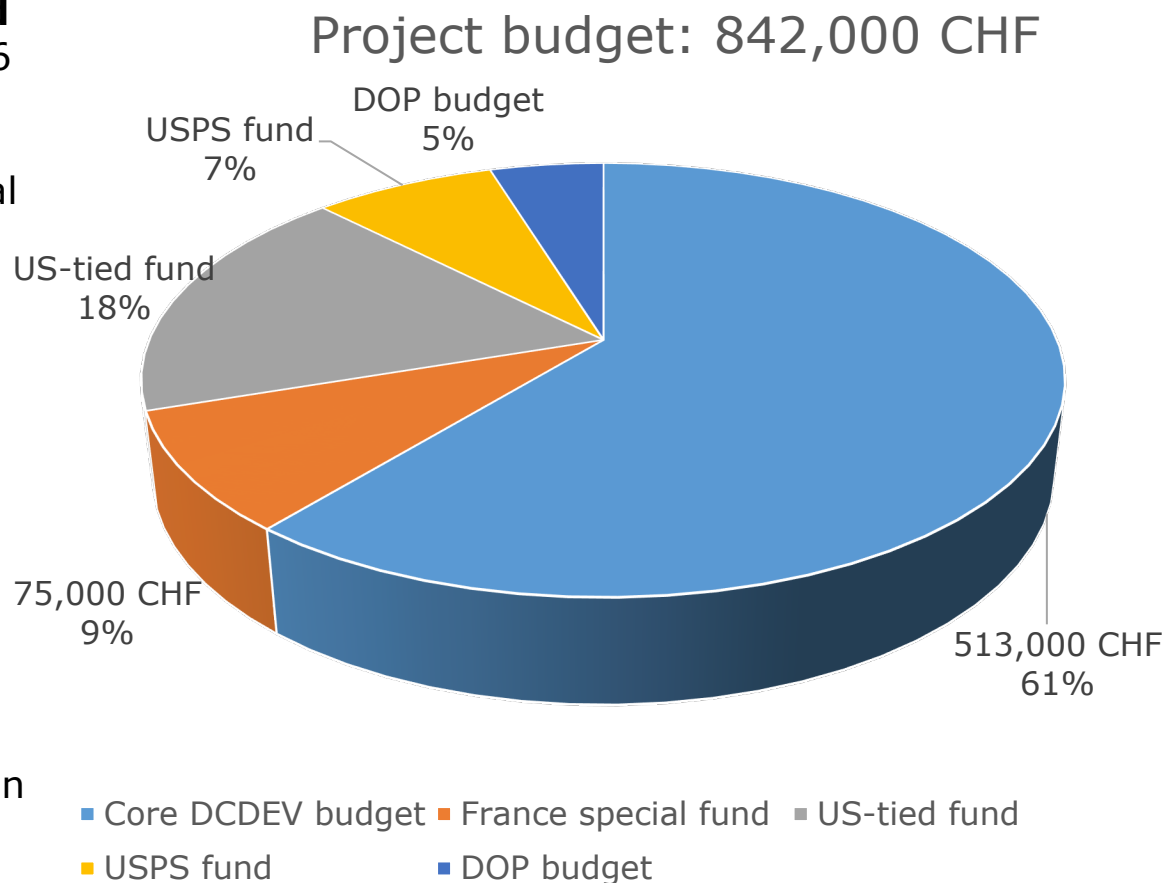

- **ORE Operational efficiency and e-commerce development** in 36 Asia-Pacific countries
- The project “Procurement of postal equipment” will help to meet the goals of the ORE project
- UPU’s PAP team is likely to get more funds for this project as has been the case in the last cycle
- In 2023:
 - UPU-OCC Special Security workshop, 27-31 March, Tonga
 - 2nd Asia Workshop 3-7 July, Bangkok
 - 2nd Pacific Workshop 18-22 Sept in Vanuatu
 - 2 special PTC workshops planned for Asia and Pacific
 - 17 LCDs/SIDS/LLDCs received fellowships to attend the UPU-WCO Joint conference, June, Tokyo.

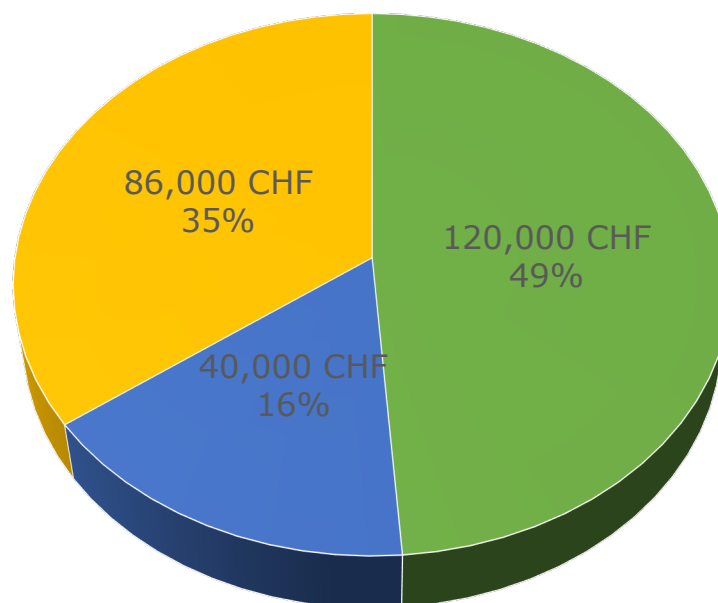




Our projects for Asia-Pacific in the 2022-2025 cycle

- **Capacity building for postal officials at the APCC** in 29 Asia-Pacific countries (19 LDCs, SIDS, LLDCs, and some DCs based on the analysis of the countries' training needs).
- This project concerns various subjects related to postal operations, e.g. customs, international mail accounting, compliance, standards, environmental sustainability, etc.)
- In 2023:
 - 38 Fellowships granted
 - EMS Workshop to be held for operational improvements
